



About New Mexico Performing Arts Society



Artistic Director Franz Vote is the driving force behind the reputation NMPAS has earned for artistic excellence. The Los Angeles native began his career at Aspen Music Festival. Then, he spent a decade in German opera houses, including those in Berlin and Munich. The Bayreuth

Festival engaged him as assistant conductor to Daniel Barenboim and James Levine from 1989-1991. He joined the conducting staff of the Metropolitan Opera in 1990, and performed at the MET for eleven seasons. In 2001, he served as music director of Wagner's *Ring der Nibelungen* in Seattle. His *Ring* performances were lauded by the New York Times and many other important media outlets. Franz Vote has lived in Santa Fe for ten years and, since 2012, has built NMPAS into one of the most respected performing arts organizations in New Mexico.



Executive director Linda Marianiello is a founding member of NMPAS. She enjoys a forty-five year career as a flute soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player. Linda has appeared as soloist with the Bavarian Radio Orchestra and the New American Chamber Orchestra, among others,

and played recitals in Bayreuth, Salzburg, Potsdam-Sans Souci, Elba, Graz, Guangzhou, and nearly every US state. She has recorded extensively for the Bavarian Radio and the MSR Classics label. Since 1982, Linda Marianiello has taught in the US, Europe and Asia, and is currently artistic director of Santa Fe Flute Immersion, an annual performance skills masterclass for students age 14 and up. Through NMPAS performances and educational programs, she enthusiastically supports the work of New Mexico's most talented professionals of today and tomorrow.
